Cleaning, inspection and cured-in-place structural rehabilitation of the existing sewers on Scenic Drive from Upper Paradise Road to West 31st Street in the City of Hamilton

Dear Sir/Madam:

The City of Hamilton has a contract with **Liqui-Force Services Ontario Inc.** to rehabilitate the existing sewer on your street. The sewer will be rehabilitated using a "No-Dig" sewer lining method, performed by **Insituform Technologies Inc.**, so there will be very few if any excavations required to complete this work. To facilitate this "No-Dig" method, some temporary restrictions to street parking may be required and, as such, your patience and co-operation will be appreciated.

Subject to weather conditions, the sewer rehabilitation is scheduled to take place in the near future. For a day or so during the work, we may request your co-operation by restricting your sewage usage as much as possible. A confirmation notice of the lining works will be hand delivered to your property 24 hours in advance of the anticipated rehabilitation works (**if you are affected**) from Insituform.

SHOULD IT BE NECESSARY THAT YOU REQUIRE FULL USAGE OF YOUR SEWER ON THE LINING DATE, PLEASE CONTACT THIS OFFICE SO THAT ALTERNATIVE ARRANGEMENTS CAN BE MADE.



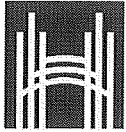

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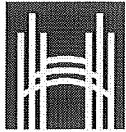

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GENERAL NOTES

Please be aware that you may experience odours (smells like plastic or glue) from the new sewer liner being installed on your street. If you can smell this odour it is the result of faulty plumbing in the home. Over time the odours will diminish as the liner is completed. If you smell odours during or after the work open all windows (where possible) and please call the Insituform® or City of Hamilton representative so they may assist you with the problem.

The odours reaching your home may be the result of a dry or broken plumbing wastewater trap in the home. The purpose of the wastewater plumbing trap is to maintain a water barrier in the pipes to prevent all sewer odours from entering the home. In rarely used drains (such as floor drains), the water in the trap can evaporate over time resulting in no water barrier to prevent the odours from entering the home. A suggestion may be to pour water (about a gallon) down all floor drains or rarely used drains (sinks, tubs, showers etc) to ensure that a water barrier is maintained in the trap. If this does not work, then it is very likely that you have a trap that requires repair. A temporary solution is to cover the suspect drains with a plastic bag of water over any open floor drains in the home, to temporarily stop or reduce odours coming from the drains. A dry or faulty trap will allow sewer odours to enter the home from time to time depending on the atmospheric conditions.

Some residents with asthma or respiratory conditions could experience discomfort and may not wish to be present during the work if their plumbing is not working correctly. A complete set of Material Safety Data Sheets is available from the City of Hamilton upon request.

We advise that if you are experiencing odours from the liner you are also allowing sewer gases to infiltrate into your home. For health reasons, the homeowner should repair these traps.
